主席的話

過去這年我們將爭取病人權益放在工作的首位,港鐵是本港最大主要交通運輸機構。立法會黃俊碩議員安排我們與港鐵管理層會面,車務總監李家潤博士帶領各部門代表聽取柏友分享,如何處理遇到柏友出現症狀時,職員應該怎樣協助,會上我們還提出希望港鐵能帶頭將「看不見的傷殘」的標誌加入關愛工作行列。

我們與無障礙關注平台、復康會一起巡查港鐵升降機、自動電梯設施,去離島體驗無障礙環境和設施並參與復康會「無障行者」活動項目,負責離島體驗首影禮。

社區教育方面,本會接受媒體邀請訪問不同柏友個案、加深大眾認識柏金遜症。此外我們亦支持主席接受提名參選香港精神獎、協助各大學申請基金研究改善柏金遜症的症狀及參與醫管局藥物建議委員會會議,講解常用柏藥更換藥廠後對柏友的影響。

為加強柏友自信,與青志體育會合作成立「後健柏乒隊」並開辦「與你一起柏住跑」,由教練安排義工學生協助柏友積極參與,培養耐力,嘗試挑戰公開賽事。



什麼是柏金遜症?

柏金遜症是一種慢性腦部衰退疾病,是由於腦部內稱作「黑質」的部位出現退化,未能產生足夠「多巴胺」而引起的。「多巴胺」是一種化學物質,負責神經訊息傳遞。

「多巴胺」數目下降,能直接影響肌肉活動,從而大 大阻礙了患者的活動能力。此病多發生於六十歲或以 上的老人身上,惟部分患者亦會早於四十歲左右發病。



什麼因素導致柏金遜症?

大多數柏金遜症是「原發性」的(即成因不明),有少部分為家族遺傳。

而下列情況亦可能引起「繼發性」柏金遜症:

- 腦炎
- 顱腦損傷
- 腫瘤
- 腦部鈣化
- 一氧化碳中毒
- 重金屬中毒



柏金遜症的主要徵狀

震顫

患者手腳持續地出現不受控制的震顫,尤以在停止活動時最為明顯。震顫多由一邊手部開始,然 後慢慢擴展到同一邊下肢,最後影響到另一邊身 體。

僵硬

手腳肌肉變得僵硬,在伸直或屈曲患者手腳時, 會發覺該部位出現重大阻力,動作有如轉動齒輪 般困難。

動作遲緩

此徵狀包括一系列現象,如書寫困難,患者所寫字體彎彎曲曲,愈寫愈細;長時間呆坐而不變動 坐姿;起步及停步方面均有困難;以及臉部缺乏 表情等。

平衡困難

由於平衡出現問題,患者慣於在起步後即以急碎細步向前衝去,以保持重心。





柏金砾症非運動徵狀

- 睡眠問題
- 情緒病
- 非自主神經系統失調
- 認知障礙
- 便秘





柏金砾棕的治療方法

現時仍沒有根治柏金遜症的方法,但可透過以下療法,舒緩病徵及減慢病情衰退速度:

藥物治療

透過定時服藥以控制病情,主要目標包括:增加多巴胺的數量;或減慢腦內多巴胺的 分解速度;或抑制乙醯膽鹼的活動。服食多巴胺補充劑類藥物,可有效舒緩病徵。

言語治療

幫助改善説話及吞讌問題。

物理治療

適量運動有助增強患者的活動能力。 如:太極、瑜珈、乒乓球、健步行

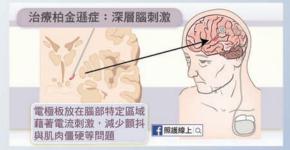
職業治療

訓練患者的自我照顧能力,使用步行器、輪椅等,於家居安裝適當扶手。

手術治療 - 深腦電刺激術

柏金遜症病人使用藥物未能取得滿意的效果,如不 自主動作或藥物失效的情況太嚴重,就可以考慮進 行手術來提高活動能力。

應用微創腦外科手術把電極植入預定的腦組織,再 透過電線連接到剌激器 (Stimulator) 。剌激器一般 是植入胸前的皮膚之下;和心臟起搏器相似。

中醫治療

在柏金遜症初期,症狀輕微的情況下,未必需要服用西藥,在這個階段可以用中醫藥 方法治療。

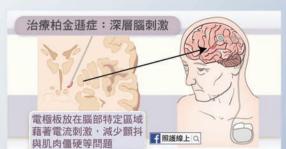
香港有大學研究以中醫治療柏金遜症,目前服用中藥、推拿、按摩、針灸,並非根治 柏金遜症的方法,只是作為舒緩柏金遜症的方法。

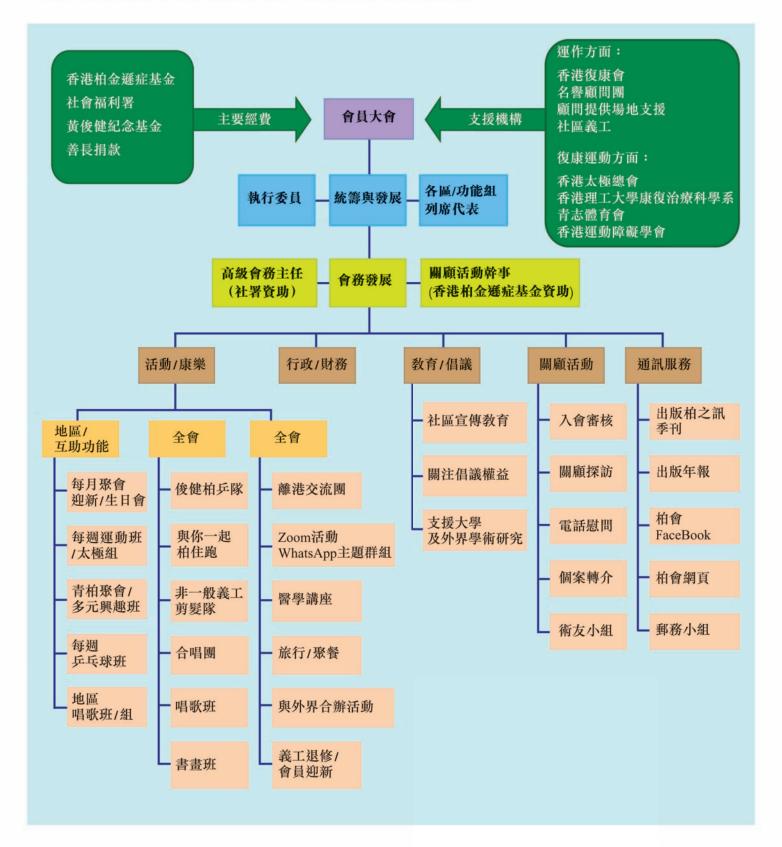

香港柏金遜症會組織架構

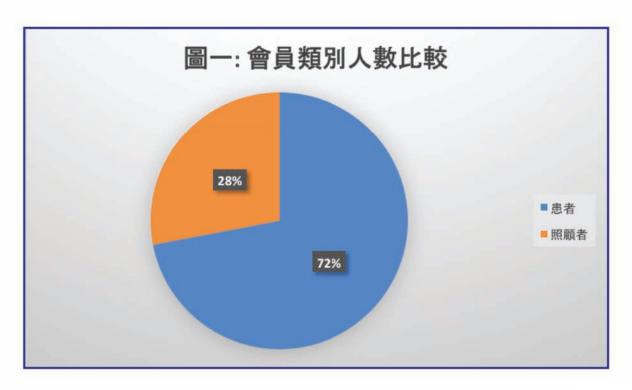
本會共有六個分區:香港島、九龍東、九龍西、新界東、新界西及將軍澳。本會的最高行政 決策單位是執行委員會(簡稱「執委會」),經會員大會選出來的執行委員組成。本會的事 務經執委會開會商議討論通過後,便交相關人員落實推行。

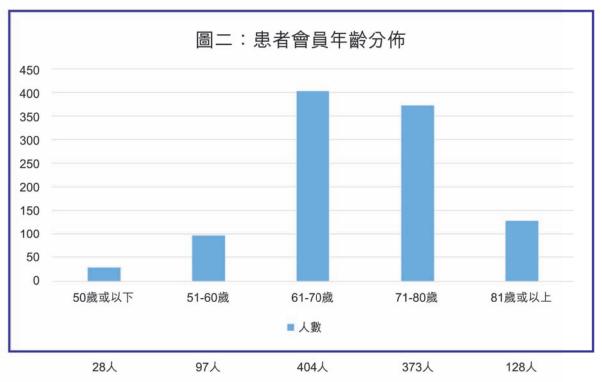




截至2023年3月31日,本會會員總人數為1475人,當中柏金遜症患者佔1059人 (72%),照顧者佔416人 (28%)。男性患者有529人,佔總患者人數50%。女性患者有530人,佔總患者人數50%。

全會患者平均年齡是70歲,男的為70歲,女的為70歲。患者人數最多的年齡組別是61-70歲,有427人,佔總患者人數的39%。在50歲或以下的患者也有15人,佔總患者人數1.4%。





遜有良朋・将愛廣傳



『遜有良朋·將愛廣傳』是本會承蒙香港柏金遜症基金資助的一個關顧計劃。關顧服務是泛指任何本會會員,志願貢獻個人的時間及精神,在不為任何物質或金錢報酬的情況下,透過不同的關顧方式,在精神上支持鼓勵一些有需要被關懷的患者會員,積極面對疾病,這個計劃全建基於會員與會員之間的互助精神之上。

計劃的服務範疇:

- ・電話關顧 致電慰問隱蔽或非活躍患者會員及跟進其需要
- 探訪關顧 對願意受訪患者會員進行探訪活動,包括家訪及院舍探望
- · 術友支援 定期舉辦聚會讓接受深腦刺激手術(DBS)的患者互相交流
- · 病友支援站 在五間醫院設立支援站為柏友提供有關本會的服務及病科資訊

此計劃由2022年1月1日至2022年12月31日,共有72名關顧義工參加計劃,總支出大約為 \$2,339.00,支出大幅減少,原因是疫情關係大部分家訪及院舍探訪已經暫停。

關顧小組會定期舉行關顧行動會議,以了解各區關顧進展。在2022/4-2023/1間,我們一共舉辦了7次關顧會議,總參與為54人次。

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1. General information

Hong Kong Parkinson's Disease Association is a Company incorporated in Hong Kong limited by guarantee and not having a share capital. The registered office of the Association is located at G/F., Wang Lai House, Wang Tau Hom Estate, Kowloon, Hong Kong.

The principal activity of the Association is to support or assist activities or programs for the benefit of Parkinson's disease patients.

The financial statements are presented in Hong Kong dollars, which is the same as the functional currency of the

2. Statement of compliance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards

The Association qualifies for the reporting exemption as a small guarantee Company under Section 359(1)(a) for the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance (Cap. 622). The Association therefore entitled to prepare and present its financial statements in accordance with the Small and Medium-sized Entity Financial Reporting Standard (the "SME-FRS") issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

These financial statements comply with the SME-FRS and have been prepared under the accrual basis of accounting and on the basis that the company is a going concern. The measurement base adopted is the historical cost convention.

3. Summary of Accounting Policies

(a) Basis preparation of financial statement

The measurement basis used in the preparation of the financial statements is the historical cost basis.

(b) Income and Expenditure Recognition

Income and expenditure is accounted for on an accrual basis, except for donations & sponsorship, Rehabus income and funding from Social Welfare Department and Hong Kong Parkinson's Disease Foundation which are accounted for on a cash basis.

Income is recognized when it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Association and when the revenue and costs, if applicable, can be measured reliably and on the following bases.

- Donations & Sporsorship and Funding received from Social Welfare Department and Rehabus income are accounted for on a cash basis.
- Income and Expenditure from Activities is recognized in the year in which the activities are held.
- Interest Income is secrued in a time proportion basis.
- Membership Fee is recognized on a basis that reflects the timing, nature and value of the benefits provided.
- Sale of goods is recognised on transfer of risks and rewards of ownership, which generally coincides with the time when goods are delivered to customers and title has passed.

All expenditure is accounted for on an accrual basis.

3. Summary of Accounting Policies (continued)

(c) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairmen losses.

The depreciable amount of an item of property, plant and equipment is allocated on a systematic basis over its estimated useful life using the straight-line method at the following annual rates:

Office Equipments 20% p.a.

The useful lives and residual values of the assets are reviewed and adjusted, if necessary, at each end of reporting period.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are finished goods.

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Cost is calculated using the first-in-first-out basis and comprises direct material cost and relevant subcontracting charges.

Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

When inventories are sold, the carrying amount of those inventories is recognised as an expense in the period in which the related revenue is recognised. The amount of any write-down of inventories to ret realisable value and all losses of inventories are recognised as an expense in the year the write-down of lors occurs. The amount of any reversal of any write-down of inventories, arising from an increase in net ralisable value, is recognised as a reduction in the amount of inventories recognised as an expense in the year in which the reversal occurs.

(e) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and at bank and demand deposits with bank. Cash equivalents are short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant this of changes in value.

(f) Financial Instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognized on the statement of financial position when the Association becomes a party to the continuous provisions of the instrument. Financial sneets and financial liabilities are initially measured as fine value. Transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or issue of financial assets and financial liabilities are added to or doubted from the fair value of the financial sasets or financial liabilities, as geoperated, on initial recognition.

Financial Assets

The Association's financial assets are classified into one of the four categories, including financial assets at fair value through profit or loss (FVTPL), held-to-maturity investments, available-for-sale (AFS) financial assets and loans and receivables. All regular way purchases or sales of financial assets are recognised and decreognised on a trade date basis. Regular way purchases or sales are purchases or sales of financial assets that require delivery of assets within the time frame established by regulation or convention is the marketplace.

(f) Financial Instruments (continued)

Loans and Receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active narket. At the end of each reporting period to initial recognition, loans and receivables (including trade and other receivables, cash and bank balances) are carried at amortized cost using the effective interest method, leas my identified impairment losses (see accounting policy in respect of impairment loss on financial assets below).

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a debt instrument and of allocating interest income over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts (including all fees on points paid or received that from an integral part of the effective interest rate, transaction costs and other premiums or discountly through the expected life of the debt instrument, or, where appropriate, a shorter period to the net carrying amount on initial recognition.

Income is recognised on an effective interest basis for debt instruments other than financial assets cla at FVTPL, of which interest income is included in net gains and losses.

Impairment of Financial Assets

Financial assets, other than those at FVIPL, are assessed for indicators of impairment at the end of the reporting period. Financial assets are impaired where there is objective evidence that, as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the financial asset, the estimated future cash flows of the investment have been affected.

For certain categories of financial asset, such as trade receivables, assets that are assessed not to be impaired individually are assessed for impairment on a collective basis. Objective evidence of impairment for a portfolio of receivables could include the Association's past resperience of collecting payments, an increase in the number of delayed psyments in the portfolio past the average credit period of 60 days, as well as observable changes in national or local economic conditions that correlate with fedatu on receivables.

For financial assets carried at amortised cost, an impairment loss is recognized in the profit or loss when th is objective evidence that the asset is impaired, and is measured as the difference between the asset's carry amount and the present value of the estimated future cash flows discounted at the original effective inter rates.

The carrying amount of the financial asset is reduced by the impairment loss directly for all financial assets.

For financial assets measured at amortised cost, if, in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised, the previously recognised impairment loss is reversed through profit or loss to the extent that the carrying amount of the investment at the date the impairment is reversed does not exceed what the amortised cost would have been had the impairment not been recognised.

Financial liabilities are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangement entered into and the definitions of financial liability.

Effective Interest Method

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial liability and of allocating interest expenses over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash payments through the expected life of the financial liability, or, where appropriate, a short period.

Derecognition of Financial Assets and Financial Liabilitie

The Association derecognises a financial asset only when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the asset expire, or when a financial asset is transferred, the Association has transferred substantially all the risks and rewards of womenhalp of the asset to another entity. If the Association relative transfers or entities substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership and continues to control the transferred asset, the Association recognises is retained interests in the asset and associated liability for amounts it may have to pay. If the Association retains substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of a transferred financial asset, the Association continues to recognise to recognise the financial asset and also recognises a collateralised borrowing for the proceeds received.

On derecognition of a financial asset, the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the sum of the consideration received and receivable and the cumulative gain or loss that had been recognised directly in reserve is recognized in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive.

The Association derecognises financial liabilities when, and only when, the Association's obligations specified in the relevant contract is discharged, cancelled or they expires.
